Simon Mignolet has given his support to the Motor Neurone Disease Association as they fight to find a cure for the fatal condition.

Mignolet's uncle lives with MND, which is a rapidly-progressing disease that affects the brain and spinal cord, and the Liverpool goalkeeper does as much as he can to help raise awareness.

Last week, he visited Aintree Hospital and The Walton Centre – an internationally recognised centre for MND research – and toured both sites before meeting staff, patients and their families.
